Option 1: Adichie talks about how reading British and American children's books as a child influenced her ideas about what stories mattered and who those stories ought to be about. How have the books you've read for fun or for school impacted your perceptions of what should and should not be written about? What are the heroes like in the books you've read? Are they diverse? Do you feel like the books you've read have characters that represent you in some way or not? Why do you think that is? How do you believe people who are not commonly represented in literature feel?
