GRADED SOCRATIC SEMINAR

- 2. A response to a peer's observation that reveals active listening/critical analysis of thoughts presented in class and evidence of close reading.
- 3. Utilizing specific components of the texts as evidence and staying "on topic"
- 4. Being mindful of how many times one speaks—I need to hear all voices and every voice needs the time/opportunity to speak.

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Participation does not mean:

- 1. Dominating the conversation
- 2. Repeating what others have said
- 3. Being disrespectful

Please note: I reserve the right to cut someone off or forbid them from further discussion

NORMS FOR THE SOCRATIC SEMINAR:

- Interact with the text while others are speaking (turn to that **passage**, add **annotations**, etc.) and **refer** to the text when you are speaking
- Listen actively to each other: **nod**, make **eye contact**, lean forward, provide feedback, and listen carefully to others.
- Invite and allow others to speak
- **Demonstrate respect** for differing opinions
- Build on what others say: ask questions to probe deeper, clarify, paraphrase and add, synthesize a variety of different views in your own summary.
